Show Intention

1. All exhibitors, trainers and parents are expected to act in a sportsmanlike manner.
2. The decision of the judge is accepted with a good attitude. The judge gives an honest and professional opinion to the best of their abilities for which they were hired.
3. All inappropriate conduct is reported, as soon as possible to the JCHSS staff.
4. JCHSS supports a family-like atmosphere that encourages participation and learning.
5. There will be no drugs, profanity, alcohol or abuse permitted or tolerated.
6. Violators of any of the above intentions are subject to immediate expulsion for the show day or show season.

Judges

1. Judges are selected from the N. C. Open Show Judges List and other lists and are in the top of their class.
2. The judge is expected to become familiar with rules and regulations concerning JCHSS.
3. The judge shall not discriminate as to breed, type, class, color, age or sex. The judge shall have the authority to place an exhibitor or equine in whatever position in a class he/she thinks merit of the exhibitor or equine justifies. The judge's decision is final.
4. The judge shall conduct their business with show officials only and be in their company while on the show grounds. Competitors will not approach the judge without prior authorization from the show manager.
5. Neither the judge nor members of their family or clients shall exhibit or handle a equine in any class at a show where they are judging

Diversity of Riders, Disciplines and Equine/Mule Breeds

We believe in the policy and philosophy that ALL equines can do ALL things within the diversity and distinction of their breed and thus should be presented with all opportunities to do so. JCHSS has attempted to "open" its show program to as many breeds as possible with the least restrictive environment in which all breeds can showcase their talents. Riders of all ages and skill levels have divisions that are suitable to promote their talents and disciplines to allow them to expand and enrich their experience. We hope that you enjoy this expanded show schedule and look forward to this year.

General and Misc. Rules Show Series

JCHSS offers a multitude of classes / divisions for the benefit of their competitors. However, competitors must understand that they must make a decision which classes / divisions they wish to participate in. We cannot and will not hold rings due to class conflicts. This will result in ring delays and a longer show day for everyone. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

- A negative Coggins test within one year is required to be admitted to the show grounds.
- All decisions made by the Judge are final.
- Payment for entry fees are expected at time of signup. Cash, Paypal, Venmo, CashApp, check, or card (subject to fees) is acceptable and a blank check may be left with the signup secretary if desired.
- All participants are required to sign a NEW Release of Liability on a per show basis. If it is a minor, a parent or trainer must sign the form.
- All dogs must be on a leash and under the control of the owner without causing any distractions.
- All returned checks will be assessed a \$25.00 processing fee AND a \$25.00 insufficient funds fee from the bank.
- Judges are selected from the N. C. Open Show Judges List, as well as other lists and are in the top of their class.
- We support and follow all rules required under the N. C. Equine Liability Law.
- Equines are not to be schooled in any area other than the riding arena or designated schooling areas. Please check with show management as to where the schooling areas are located.
- Equines are not to be ridden in the vicinity of the arena while classes are being conducted.
- Trainers /parents are not permitted in the arena while classes are being held except in those classes where it is specified (i.e. future entry, etc.).
- Any equine and/or rider exhibiting unsafe or unpredictable behavior during a class will be immediately excused from the arena for the safety of themselves and other riders and/or equines without refund of show fees. Show management reserves the right to ascertain what qualifies as “unsafe and unpredictable behavior”.
- Any equine that is deemed lame or unsound by show management will be excused from the ring.
- Show management reserves the right to refuse an exhibitor entry into any class when unsafe behavior is exhibited.
- The show management, ring steward, or judge may disqualify anyone mistreating an animal or displaying unsportsmanlike conduct.
- No drugs, alcohol, profanity or unruly behavior will be tolerated. This is a family event. Violators will be asked to leave.
- All persons are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner towards one another and show staff. If a violation of this rule is reported and / or witnessed by anyone the offending parties will be dealt with by the show management.
- Show management reserves the right to change, add or delete any classes from any show.
- Failure to enter the show ring within 2 minutes after class call will result in rider elimination from that class and a non-refund of monies. A tack change may be requested to avoid this issue.
- Scratching from a class must be made to the entry secretary at least **THREE (3)** classes in advance or the entry fee will be charged for the class. A class may only be scratched one time for a refund. It may be added back, but if the rider chooses to scratch again, the class will be charged.
- Sign up for a class must be made to the entry secretary at least **two (2)** classes in advance.
- The rain date for each show is the following day (Sunday), contingent on facility availability.

- We support all Breed Competition Programs that recognize open shows as alternative shows and will assist with any necessary paperwork for riders / equine to earn points through their registered equine.
- Point earnings for each show will be based on one rider / one equine combination unless otherwise noted.
- Future Entry riders may only compete in their respective classes one time during the show day.
- The exhibitor is responsible for errors on the entry blank.
- Exhibitors may enter or leave the ring only at the direction of the judge or ringmaster.
- Action devices such as chains, rollers, etc and those similar are not permitted on the show ground. Such equines/owners found violating these rules will immediately be excused from the show grounds. Built up/stacked up equines, other than thin protective/therapeutic pads, are not permitted.
- If an equine is deemed not capable to complete the show season due to an injury or other health related complication and has official notification from a licensed veterinarian, a rider may switch their points to another mount. This may only be done with notification from a veterinarian. Also, if an equine is sold during the show season, points can be transferred if the bill of sale and date is recorded with the JCHSS Points Secretary in writing (only once per year). If a problem occurs with a leased equine, special considerations may also be given depending on the circumstances. Show management must be notified of these changes prior to showing. Points are based on a one rider / one equine system.
- Trainers and / or parents are expected to be with their students under age 18 years at all times while the students are schooling their equines in the riding arena.

Statement of Responsibility: The JCHSS or Show Management will in no way be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it will be a condition of the entry that each exhibitor shall hold the equine show and the Johnston County Livestock Arena blameless for any loss or accident to his or her equine, equines, or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. Nor shall they be held responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed, or stolen and will not be responsible for or liable for injury sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators, employees or any other interested parties or third parties. All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damages incurred by them or their agents to any properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly.

Definitions:

Action Devices

- Action devices such as chains, rollers, and those similar to this are not permitted. Equines with platforms or stack shoes are NOT permitted on the show grounds. Exception for protective/therapeutic pads may be made on a per case basis

Non-Trotting Equine Policy

- Non-trotting equines are permitted to enter any classes that are GAYP, ask for Secondary Gait, or specify Saddle Pleasure Type or Non-Trotting, with the exception of Stock and Field Type Classes. They will be expected to perform their pleasure gait in lieu of the trot or jog. This is the only distinction that will be made.

Secondary Gait (SG)

- Trot, jog or pleasure gait. The pleasure gait is for non-trotting breeds.

Go as you please (GAYP)

- Go as you please classes, shall include a walk and then any other gait desired by the rider. Same gait should be performed in both directions.

Stock Type

- This includes Quarter Equines, Paints, Appaloosas and any equine fitting this general classification (registration papers are not required.) This type of equine may not cross enter into classes for Field Type, Saddle Pleasure, or Non-Trotting Equines. Miniature equines are not permitted.

Field Type

- This includes Thoroughbreds, Warmbloods, Drafts and any equine fitting this general classification (registration papers are not required). This type of equine may not cross enter into classes for Stock Type, Saddle Pleasure, or Non-Trotting Equines. Miniature equines are not permitted.

Miniature Horse

- A Miniature Horse is defined as any equine that stands at 38 inches or shorter. Miniature horses may NOT enter the Saddle Pleasure, Non-Trotting, Field, Stock, Show Pony, Miniature Mule, Miniature Donkey, or Miniature Longear type classes. Cross entry between these classes is not permitted.

Show Pony

- A Show Pony is defined as any equine that stands over 38 inches, but not more than 48 inches, or 12 hands.. Show Ponies may NOT enter the Saddle Pleasure, Field, Stock, Miniature Horse, Miniature Mule, Miniature Donkey, or Miniature Longear type classes. Cross entry between these classes is not permitted.

Longear

- A longear is defined as any donkey, mule, or hinny measuring over 48 inches.

Miniature Longear

- Miniature Longears are any donkey, mule, or hinny that measures 48 inches or less.
 - TAMMA Classes: Mini Mule - under 40"; Pony Mule - 40" to 52"
- Mini Longears shall NOT cross enter Mini Horse or Show Pony Classes.

Green Equine

A green equine is an equine that is in their first or second year of showing. This is not discipline specific.

Future Entry

- Future Entry is a rider who must have an assistant while riding. Future Entry riders may not cross enter into any other riding classes. Points from this division will be based on the rider only; the equine will not be considered. A rider may use multiple mounts during the year without penalty. If a Future Entry rider rides a Miniature Equine, they may show said equine in our Miniature Horse Classes.

Novice Rider

- A novice rider is a rider who has shown less than 4 years, not including showing in the Future Entry Division.
- All riders age 10 and under are considered novices.

Academy Rider

- Riders in this division must be under riding instruction on their own equine or a lesson equine. Equines are NOT judged.
- Points from this division will be based on the rider only. The equine will not be considered. If a rider chooses to cross enter into other divisions, points for those divisions will be based on the rider/equine combination.

Size Classification

- **Show Pony:** over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands).
- **Miniature Horse:** 38 inches and under
- **Miniature Longear:** 48 inches and under
 - **TAMMA:** Mini Mule - under 40"; Pony Mule - 40" to 52"
- Equines over 48" shall not cross enter into any classes that specify Show Pony, Miniature Horse, Miniature Longear, Miniature Donkey, or Miniature Mule.

Age Divisions

- Age division shall be determined by the exhibitor's age as of January 1st of the show year.
- **Youth** - 17 years and under
- **Adult** - 18 years and over

Class Performance Rules

- Rules in this pamphlet will have precedent over all other rules. Under other circumstances, consultation of the USEF Handbook and breed specific books such as but not limited to AQHA, APHA, APHC, AHA, ISHR, PTHA, PHBA, ADMS, AMHR, ADS, TREC, NASMDA, TAMMA, TWHBEA Versatility Handbook and others will govern with exception being given to age divisions listed above
- Cross entry of Horse/Rider combinations between Ranch and Western classes is not permitted.
- Show management reserves the right to make exceptions to any tack or attire that may be in question. A competitor requesting a review, must do so BEFORE the show day.
- Equines and riders to be shown with correct, **safe**, and appropriate English or Western attire. Formal dress is not required. However appropriate shoes with heel, shirt with at least a 4” sleeve, and pants (no shorts)
- Bitless Bridles/Hackamores shall be permitted in rail/flat classes, so long as the equine remains safe and predictable. Show management reserves the right to ascertain what qualifies as “unsafe and unpredictable behavior”
- In Western and Ranch classes, equines of any age may be shown in a snaffle bit with use of 2 hands on the reins.
- In English classes, bridles shall be light show type; either snaffle, Pelham, full bridle or kimberwicke bit acceptable.
- Unacceptable tack shall include figure eights, drop or flash nosebands, martingales and tiedowns –
- **See Rule Exceptions below**
 - **Over Fences Classes** - Standing martingales are permitted, but are prohibited in all flat classes.
 - **Saddleseat Riders** - martingales are permitted for riders 13 and under or Academy.
 - **Future Entry** - martingales are permitted
- All riders 12 years of age and under are required to wear an ASTM approved helmet while mounted.
- All riders in over fences classes or schooling over fences are required to wear an ASTM approved riding helmet which must be securely fastened.
- Protective boots, leg wraps and bandages are allowed in jumping, Ranch Riding, Western Horsemanship, English "type" equitation on the flat and over fences classes.
- Training equipment is not permitted in any classes unless otherwise stated.
- A canter / lope and backup (at the judge’s discretion) is required in all Pleasure classes, unless otherwise specified.

Class Specifications

Halter

Halter - Most Colorful - All Ages / Cannot enter in Solid Color

- Equines in this class should be an equine whose partial breed standards are based on color such as pinto, paint, appaloosa, palominos, buckskins, gruellas, cremellos, and possess such markings.
- To be shown in hand at a walk and secondary gait
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Equines of all ages can enter this class; Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.
- May not cross enter into Halter - Solid Colored

Halter - Solid Colored - All Ages / Cannot enter in Most Colorful

- Equines in this class should be a solid colored equine not being of a paint, appaloosa, pinto or other equine whose partial breed standards are based on color: bays, greys, sorrel/chestnuts, black, etc.
- To be shown in hand at a walk and secondary gait
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Equines of all ages can enter this class; Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.
- May not cross enter into Halter - Most Colorful

Halter - Junior Horse - 2 & under

- To be shown in hand at walk and secondary gait
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Equines 2 years and younger can enter this class. Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Halter - Field Type - All Ages

- To be shown in hand at walk and trot
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Only Field Type equines are permitted in this class – cross entry is not permitted.
- Equines of all ages can enter this class. Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Halter - Stock Type – All Ages

- To be shown in hand at a walk and trot
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Only Stock Type equines are permitted in this class – cross entry is not permitted.
- Equines of all ages can enter this class. Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Halter - Non-Trotting - All Ages

- To be shown in hand at walk and secondary gait.
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Only Non-Trotting Type equines are permitted in this class – cross entry is not permitted.
- Equines of all ages can enter this class. Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Halter - Longear - All Ages

- To be shown in hand at walk and secondary gait.
- To be shown in English or Western tack
- Only Longear equines standing over 48” may enter
- Equines of all ages can enter this class. Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Showmanship at Halter Youth and Adult / English or Western attire

- Equine to be shown in English or Western attire
- Exhibitors are to show in their respective age divisions only. (Youth: 17 & younger; Adult: 18 & older)
- Judge 30% on appearance of equine, 10% on appearance of exhibitor and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude)
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class

Showmanship at Halter - Green Equine –English or Western attire

- Only green equines are permitted in this class
- Equine to be shown in English or Western attire
- Judge 30% on appearance of equine, 10% on appearance of exhibitor and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude)
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Showmanship at Halter - Non-Trotting –English or Western attire

- Only Non-Trotting equines are permitted in this class
- Equine to be shown in English or Western attire
- Judge 30% on appearance of equine, 10% on appearance of exhibitor and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude)
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Miniature equines are NOT permitted in this class.

Western Dressage Suitability

Western Dressage Suitability W/SG

- To evaluate the horse's potential as a Western Dressage mount.
- 70% - gaits and transitions 30% - rider position, seat, and effective use of aids.
- Working Walk, Working SG, Free Walk (one way), may back
- Open to all breeds

Western Dressage Suitability W/SG/L

- To evaluate the horse's potential as a Western Dressage mount.
- 70% - gaits and transitions 30% - rider position, seat, and effective use of aids.
- Working Walk, Working SG, Working Lope, Free Walk (one way), may back
- Open to all breeds

Western Dressage Suitability Equitation

- Only the rider is to be judged
- This is a patterned class
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Western tack/attire
- Equine to be shown at a walk / secondary gait.

Western

Cross entry of Horse/Rider combinations between Ranch and Western classes is **not permitted**.

In Western and Ranch classes, equines of any age may be shown in a snaffle bit with use of 2 hands on the reins.

Western Walk / Jog – Field Type

- Equines to be shown under appropriate western attire and tack
- Equines to be shown at a walk and jog.
- Only Field Type equines are permitted in this class

Western Walk / Jog – Stock Type

- Equines to be shown under appropriate western attire and tack
- Equines to be shown at a walk and jog.
- Only Stock Type equines are permitted in this class

Western Walk / Secondary Gait – Non-Trotting

- Equines to be shown under appropriate western attire and tack
- Equines to be shown at a walk and jog.
- Only Non-Trotting equines are permitted in this class

Western GAYP – Youth

- Equines to be shown under appropriate western attire and tack
- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring
- Rider must be in the Youth age division of 17 years and younger.

Western GAYP – Adult

- Equines to be shown under appropriate western attire and tack
- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring
- Rider must be in the Adult age division of 18 years and over.

Western Walk/Secondary Gait - Academy

- Equine to be shown at a walk and secondary gait.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Western attire and tack
- Academy Entry is considered a beginner rider: someone who has been showing for less than 2 years except for the Future Entry classes. Riders in this division must be under riding instruction on their own horse or a lesson horse.

Western Walk/Secondary Gait - Novice

- Equine to be shown at a walk and secondary gait.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Western attire and tack
- A novice rider is a rider who has shown less than 4 years, not including showing in the Future Entry Division. All riders age 10 and under are considered novices.
- shown under appropriate Western attire and tack
- Equine to be shown at a walk / secondary gait

Western GAYP - Green Equine

- Only green equines are permitted in this class
- A green equine is defined as a equine that is in its first or second year of being shown.
- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Western attire and tack

Western Pleasure - Walk/Secondary Gait/Lope

- Equines to be shown under appropriate western attire and tack
- Equine to be shown at a walk, secondary gait, lope and back up.

Western Equitation Walk / Secondary Gait

- Only the rider is to be judged
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Western tack and attire.
- Equine to be shown at a walk / secondary gait.

Western Horsemanship Walk / Secondary gait (Pattern & Rail Work)

- Only the rider is to be judged
- There is pattern and rail work.
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Western tack and attire.
- Equine to be shown at a walk / secondary gait.

Ranch Division

Cross entry of Horse/Rider combinations between Ranch and Western classes is **not permitted**.

In Western and Ranch classes, equines of any age may be shown in a snaffle bit with use of 2 hands on the reins.

This division is open to all equines. The object of the Ranch Division is to promote the abilities of the all around versatile working equine whether ridden on the ranch, on the trail, or in the ring and where true western tradition is genuinely honored. The purpose of the ranch riding class is to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working ranch horse riding outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, relaxed, quiet, soft, and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse can be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein without requiring undue restraint, but not show on a full drape of reins.

GROOMING:

- A. In conformation classes, equines are to be shown in good working halter; rope, braided, nylon or plain leather. No silver will be allowed on halters.
- B. Hair dyes or hoof black, hoof polish and/or oil is not allowed and will result in the equine being disqualified from the class.
- C. Braiding or banding of the mane is prohibited
- D. Tail extensions are prohibited
- E. Trimming of bridle path, fetlocks, facial hair, and ears is permitted but a horse left in a natural state will not be penalized.

SADDLE/SILVER REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged. In no circumstance is any amount of silver to have any advantage over good working tack. Exhibitors cannot be disqualified for silver on the saddle or headstall, except when it is very excessive (beyond conchos and small corner plates).
- B. Tongue Tying is prohibited
- C. Competitors are encouraged to use a breast collar and a rear cinch
- D. Romal reins are allowed in all classes

EXHIBITORS ATTIRE:

- A. Appropriate western attire includes:
 - a. Long sleeve shirt (in times of heat, a shirt with a 4" sleeve may be worn) with collar (buttons or snaps are preferred),
 - b. Western hat - **helmets may be worn in place of western hat,**
 - c. Boots with heels

Ranch GAYP

- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- The judge may ask for an extended walk. Extended secondary gait may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.

Ranch Walk / Secondary Gait / Lope

- Equine to be shown at a walk secondary gait, and lope in both directions
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- The judge may ask for an extended gaits. Extended gaits may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.

Ranch Walk / Trot - Stock Type

- Equine to be shown at a Walk and Trot in both directions
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- The judge may ask for an extended gaits. Extended gaits may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.
- Only Stock Type equines are permitted in this class

Ranch Walk / Trot - Field Type

- Equine to be shown at a Walk and Trot in both directions
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- The judge may ask for an extended gaits. Extended gaits may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.
- Only Field Type equines are permitted in this class

Ranch Go As you Please - Youth

- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring The judge may ask for extension of either gait. Extended secondary gait may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- Rider must be 17 years and younger.

Ranch Go As you Please - Adult

- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring The judge may ask for extension of either gait. Extended secondary gait may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- Rider must be 18 year or older

Ranch Go As you Please - Green Equine

- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring The judge may ask for extension of either gait. Extended secondary gait may be ridden sitting in the saddle, posting or standing in the stirrups.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.
- Only green equines are permitted in this class
- A green equine is defined as an equine that is in its first or second year of being shown.

Ranch Riding.

- There is a patterned class
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Each horse will work individually, performing both required and optional maneuvers, The required maneuvers will include the walk, trot, and lope both directions and the extended trot and extended lope at least one direction, as well as stops and back. Three optional maneuvers may include a side pass, turns of 360 degrees or more, change of lead (simple or flying), walk, trot, or lope over a pole(s); or some reasonable combination of maneuvers that would be reasonable for a ranch horse to perform. The maneuvers may be arranged in various combinations.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate Ranch attire and tack. Please read the special rules regarding tack, attire and grooming for this division.

Future Entry

Future Entry - Leadline

- Trainer or parent must accompany rider and have secure hold on lead rope at all times
- Only the rider is being judged
- English or Western attire and tack may be worn.
- Rider may not cross enter into other riding class
- Equines must be wearing tack that allows the assistant to have control.

- To evaluate the horse's potential as a Dressage mount.
- 70% - gaits and transitions 30% - rider position, seat, and effective use of aids.
- Open to all breeds

Dressage Suitability Equitation

- Only the rider is to be judged
- This is a patterned class
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Equines to be shown under appropriate English tack/attire
- Equine to be shown at a walk / secondary gait.

English

English Go As You Please

- Equines to be shown under appropriate English attire and tack (may consist of huntseat, saddleseat, dressage or any “English style”)
- Equine to be shown at a walk and any other gait. Other gait must be the same both ways of the ring

English Walk / Trot – Stock Type

- Equines to be shown at a walk and trot
- Equines to be shown under appropriate English attire and tack (may consist of huntseat, saddleseat, dressage or any “English style”)
- Only Stock Type equines are permitted in this class – cross entry is not permitted.

English Walk / Trot – Field Type

- Equine to be shown at a walk and trot
- Equines to be shown under appropriate English attire and tack (may consist of huntseat, saddleseat, dressage or any “English style”)
- Only Field Type equines are permitted in this class – cross entry is not permitted.

English Walk / Secondary Gait – Non-Trotting

- Equines to be shown under appropriate English attire and tack (may consist of huntseat, saddleseat, dressage or any “English style”)
- Equine to be shown at a walk and secondary Gate.
- Only Non-Trotting Type equines are permitted in this class

English GAYP – Youth

- Equines to be shown under appropriate English attire and tack (may consist of huntseat, saddleseat, dressage or any “English style”)

- Rider must be in the Junior age division: 17 years of age and younger.

English GAYP – Adult

- Gaited equines are permitted in this class and will be asked to do their secondary gait in place of trotting

English Equitation Walk / Secondary Gait (Pattern & rail work)

- Only the rider is to be judged
- There is pattern and rail work.
- Pattern will be posted a minimum of 1 hour before the class
- Equines to be shown under appropriate english tack/attire
- Equine to be shown at a walk / secondary gait.

Hunter Pleasure

Maiden Division

- This class is open to All Types of equines / ponies.
- RIDERS **MAY NOT CROSS ENTER** INTO ANY OTHER JUMPING CLASSES
- ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR HELMETS IN OVER FENCES CLASSES
- This class is open only to riders in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over fences.
- In any Equitation (EQ) classes, only the rider is being judged
- Equines/ponies/riders to be shown under appropriate huntseat attire and tack
- Riders must secondary gait or canter the course and will consist of 4-6 fences
- The jump pattern will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins

Limited Division

- This class is open to All Types of equines / ponies.

- ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR HELMETS IN OVER FENCES CLASSES
- Equines/ponies to be shown under appropriate huntseat attire and tack
- In any Equitation (EQ) classes only the rider is being judged
- Riders must canter the course and will consist of 6-8 fences
- The jump pattern will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins

Miniatures and Show Pony Halter

Miniature Horse Halter – Open

- This class is open to miniature horses only.
- Horses must stand no taller than 38 inches.
- Youth shall not show a senior stallion. Stallions are considered Senior from their 3 year old year and beyond.
- May not cross enter into Miniature Horse Stock Halter – Open

Miniature Horse Youth Mares and Geldings – All Ages

- This class is open to miniature horses only.
- Horses must stand no taller than 38 inches.
- This class is open to miniature horse mares and geldings of all ages.
- Horses shall be handled by a youth age 17 or younger; an adult may accompany youth for safety.

Miniature Horse Stock – Open

- This class is open to miniature horses only.
- Horses must stand no taller than 38 inches.
- This class is open to miniature horses of all ages.
- Shall be judged using the Standard of Style of the Western Stock Halter horse and the required Presentation and Appointments specified for this division, judged 75% on conformation and 25% on presentation and appointments.
- The Western Stock Halter horse will be shown in equipment and appointments of the traditional Western Stock show ring. It will exhibit good manners and responsiveness to its handler, it will stand quiet and square for inspection.
- May not cross enter into Miniature Horse Halter - Open

Miniature Horse Multi Color - All Ages

- Class is open to pinto, appaloosa, and pintaloosa horses only.
- This class is open to miniature horses only,
- Horses must stand no taller than 38 inches.
- Horses of all ages can enter this class.
- May not cross enter into Solid Color

Miniature Horse Solid Color - All Ages

- Class is open to any color other than pinto, appaloosa, and pintaloosa.
- This class is open to miniature horses only.
- Horses must stand no taller than 38 inches.
- Horses of all ages can enter this class.
- May not cross enter into Multi Color

Mini Mule Halter - John

- This class is open to miniature mule Johns only
- This class is open to miniature mule Johns of all ages

Mini Mule Halter - Molly

- This class is open to miniature mule Mollys only
- This class is open to miniature mule Mollys of all ages

Mini Mule Halter - Youth

- This class is open to miniature mules Mollys and gelded Johns only
- This class is open to miniature mules of all ages
- Mule shall be handled by a youth age 17 or younger; an adult may accompany youth for safety.

Mini Donkey Halter - Open

- This class is open to miniature donkey Jacks, Jennets, and geldings
- This class is open to miniature donkeys of all ages

Mini Mule Halter - Matched Pairs

- Judged 50% conformation and equal qualities and 50% suitability to perform as a matched team.

Show Pony Halter – Open

- This class is open to small ponies only standing over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands).
- Youth shall not show a senior stallion. Stallions are considered Senior from their 3 year old year and beyond.
- This class is open to show ponies of all ages.
- May not cross enter into Show Pony Stock Halter - Open

Show Pony Youth Mares and Geldings – All Ages

- This class is open to show ponies only standing over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands).
- This class is open to show pony mares and geldings of all ages.
- Pony shall be handled by a youth age 17 or younger; an adult may accompany youth for safety.

Show Pony Stock Halter – Open

- This class is open to show ponies only standing over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands).
- This class is open to show ponies of all ages.
- Shall be judged using the Standard of Style of the Western Stock Halter horse and the required Presentation and Appointments specified for this division, judged 75% on conformation and 25% on presentation and appointments.
- The Western Stock Halter horse will be shown in equipment and appointments of the traditional Western Stock show ring. It will exhibit good manners and responsiveness to its handler, it will stand quiet and square for inspection.
- May not cross enter into Show Pony Halter - Open

Show Pony Multi Color - All Ages

- Class is open to pinto, appaloosa, and pintoaloosa horses only.
- This class is open to show ponies only standing over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands).
- Ponies of all ages can enter this class.
- May not cross enter into Solid Color

Small Pony Solid Color - All Ages

- Class is open to any color other than pinto, appaloosa, and pintaloosa.
- This class is open to show ponies only standing over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands).
- Ponies of all ages can enter this class.
- May not cross enter into Multi Color

Miniatures and Show Pony In-Hand Performance

Liberty - Mini Horse, Mini Mule, and Show Pony

- General: Liberty is demonstrating the natural beauty of the pony/horse. Ponies/Horses/Mules are to be judged on style, grace, animation, gaits, presence, and ease of catching. The liberty animal is expected to perform at both a canter and a trot.
- Ponies/Horses/Mules will be judged beginning when the halter is removed by the exhibitor (the individual wearing the number) and until caught and haltered by the exhibitor. Time of liberty shall be 1½ minutes; time to catch shall be 2 minutes.
- It is the Steward's responsibility to time Liberty classes and to be in possession of a stopwatch. The Steward should be in the same location as the judge(s) to adjudicate the class. Timing will begin when the halter is dropped, not when the music starts, and the show announcer will announce TIME when the 1½ minutes performance has ended to signal the exhibitor that they can begin the catch. Continue to time the catch. Liberty When the 2 minute catch time has elapsed, the show announcer will announce TIME to signal the end of the catch if the animal has not been caught. If the catch is not completed in the 2 minute allotted time frame, the exhibitor is disqualified.
- Only the exhibitor can touch the animal during the catch. The pony/horse/mule must be caught and haltered by the exhibitor only within 2 minutes or be disqualified. The assistant may not touch the pony/horse/mule at any time. There will be "No Baiting" (no use of hay, grain, clickers, etc.) of Liberty ponies/horses/mules during the catch or it will be disqualified.
- Music is required.
- No deliberate interference with the pony/horse/mule from outside the ring. Announcement is to be made prior to the class to specify that no outside assistance is allowed.
- All ponies/horses/mules entered in the Liberty class must be at least one year old.
- Exhibitor and assistant should wear appropriate, tasteful attire. A safe costume or theme outfit is allowed for the exhibitor and assistant only. Pony/Horse/mule will not be allowed to wear anything once the halter has been removed: no costume, ribbons or glitter.
- Exception: Moderns/ASPR regularly braided with ribbon in foretop and first lock of hair in mane as is customary/permitted in that division may maintain their braids in liberty class.
- If a pony/horse/mule should fall during its performance, the entry is disqualified.
- Entry will be disqualified if pony/horse/mule leaves the ring during competition or catch time.

Showmanship - Miniature Horse

- This class is open to miniature horses only.
- Horses must stand no taller than 38 inches.
- Horses of all ages can enter this class.
- Judge 30% on appearance of equine, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship
- Youth under the age of 12 may not show a stallion
- Showmanship pattern will be posted 1 hour before the class.

Showmanship - Show Pony

- This class is open to show ponies only standing over 38 inches to 48" (12 hands)
- Ponies of all ages can enter this class.
- Judge 30% on appearance of equine, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship
- Youth under the age of 12 may not show a stallion
- Showmanship pattern will be posted 1 hour before the class.

Showmanship - Mini Mule

- This class is open to miniature mules only.
- Miniature mules of all ages can enter this class.
- Judge 30% on appearance of mule, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship
- Youth under the age of 12 may not show a stallion
- Showmanship pattern will be posted 1 hour before the class.

Showmanship - Mini Donkey

- This class is open to miniature donkeys only.
- Miniature donkeys of all ages can enter this class.
- Judge 30% on appearance of equine, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship
- Youth under the age of 12 may not show a stallion
- Showmanship pattern will be posted 1 hour before the class.

Miniature Horse Hunter In-Hand

- This class is open to miniature horses standing no taller than 38 inches.
- Horse must be age 3 or older
- HUNTER - The Hunter Class should be in keeping with the traditional country-setting Hunt, where elegance, style, and ease in stride and overcoming obstacles such as walls, fences, waterways, and so forth were overcome quickly and at an even pace. Overall way of going while maintaining a steady, even, stride and overcoming the jumps or obstacles in sequence without refusals, knockdowns, or circling is what the Hunter Class will be judged upon. Three refusals will result in elimination as well as fall of the equine and/or exhibitor. Being off course or crossing your paths will also result in elimination.

Show Pony Hunter In-Hand

- This class is open to show ponies standing over 38 inches to 48 inches (12 hands).
- Equine must be age 3 or older
- HUNTER - The Hunter Class should be in keeping with the traditional country-setting Hunt, where elegance, style, and ease in stride and overcoming obstacles such as walls, fences, waterways, and so forth were overcome quickly and at an even pace. Overall way of going while maintaining a steady, even, stride and overcoming the jumps or obstacles in sequence without refusals, knockdowns, or circling is what the Hunter Class will be judged upon. Three refusals will result in elimination as well as fall of the equine and/or exhibitor. Being off course or crossing your paths will also result in elimination.

Mini Longear Hunter In-Hand

- This class is open to miniature mules and donkeys.
- Miniature mules and donkeys must be age 3 or older
- HUNTER - The Hunter Class should be in keeping with the traditional country-setting Hunt, where elegance, style, and ease in stride and overcoming obstacles such as walls, fences, waterways, and so forth were overcome quickly and at an even pace. Overall way of going while maintaining a steady, even, stride and overcoming the jumps or obstacles in sequence without refusals, knockdowns, or circling is what the Hunter Class will be judged upon. Three refusals will result in elimination as well as fall of the equine and/or exhibitor. Being off course or crossing your paths will also result in elimination.

Coon Jumping

- Open to all ages of exhibitors but any youth exhibitor must have a responsible adult in the ring during the class. This adult may not physically assist except in case of an uncontrollable incident.
- Equipment: Freestanding jump will have a single, horizontal, freely sliding crossbar which will be supported by wooden dowels no more than 1/4" in diameter which will break and drop the crossbar if the animal fails to make the jump. Horizontal width of the jump will be a minimum of 8' feet. Holes for dowel pins can be at 1" or 2" increments
- Size of Box: Animals in the small height class will jump from inside a 10' marked box.
- Size of initial Jump: Initial jump will be determined by the chest height of the smallest animal in the class. Initial jump must be cleared to qualify for placing.
- Timing: Each jumping attempt is to be timed by a stopwatch with a required backup stopwatch. Time starts when the first hoof touches the ground in the box. e. class
- Routine:
 - Stop before Jumping: After entering the marked box area, the animal must stop before jumping.
 - Attempts: Two attempts may be made at each height in a maximum of 60 seconds. Time is stopped only to replace pins. Pins should be checked between jumps. Attempts will be considered:
 - If animal steps out of box; If animal breaks pin or pins; If animal pushes jumps more than 2"
 - Handler: Handler may stand to either side of box, but must hold reins or lead rope in hands at all times. Failure to do so is a disqualification. Handler is not to hold or touch the jump in any way, except for placing blanket or cover before animal begins attempt. Holding cover, jump bar, standard or pin while competing is an immediate disqualification.
 - Covering Jump: A blanket or cover may be used over the jump if the handler desires.
- Abuse: No physical abuse or force of the animal will be allowed.
- Ties: Should two or more animals tie for the height, the animal which clears the jump in one attempt will be the winner, regardless of time. If both animals clear the jump on the same attempt (first or second), the animal with the shortest time will be the winner. If none of the animals have jumped a particular height, then the jump will be lowered until one or more jumps. If two or more animals have still not jumped the same height, the one making the most attempts places higher

Driving

General Rules:

1. All carriage classes are open to single or multiple horses unless otherwise specified.
2. All carriage driving classes are open to stallions, mares, and geldings unless otherwise specified.

Equine: The main trait for any pleasure driving horse is its ability to give a pleasurable drive. Soundly obedient yet responsive, (a horse that would drive out privately on the road) has a strong presence. Elasticity in its step, working with a lifted back, flexed at the poll, hind-end engaged and not on the fore-hand, head straight while traveling and keeps its balance while bending in turns. Collected, walks and stands willingly and quietly

Driver: The driver should be seated comfortably on the seat so to be relaxed and effective. Either one or two-handed methods of driving is acceptable. Elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent “feel” of the horse’s mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one style over another.

Exhibitor Attire: Drivers should strive to present an appropriate turnout. “Appropriate” indicates the balance and pleasing appearance of the combination of the horse and vehicle. Factors determining the above include compatible size, type and weight of horse and vehicle. The way of going of the horse may also affect the overall appearance.

Tack and Equipment:

1. Light harness (breast or collar type)
2. To be shown in a suitable two or four wheeled carriage pleasure type driving vehicle.

Miniature Horse Driving - Working

- This class is open to miniature horses only standing no taller than 38 inches.
- Gait requirements - Equines shall enter the ring counterclockwise (to the right) at a Slow Trot. All equines are to be shown both ways of the arena at a Walk, Slow Trot, Working Trot, and Strong Trot. All gaits to be performed in a smooth, relaxed, balanced manner. Each equine shall be required to back readily and straight and stand quietly.
- Martingales are optional.
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- An appropriate driving whip shall be carried (in hand or in vehicle) at all times while driving.
- Headers: A header is a capable person 13 years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that will affect the performance of any Miniature equine. Only one header is allowed per equine. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the equine when the judge is inspecting the equine, and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the equine is needed. Adult (18 years of age or older) headers are mandatory for all youth drivers and optional for all other drivers.
- No youth 12 years of age or under may drive a stallion.
- Equine must be 3 years of age or older.

Miniature Horse Driving - Open

- This class is open to miniature equine only standing no taller than 38 inches.
- Gait requirements—to be shown both ways of the arena at a Walk, Slow Trot, and Working Trot. Equine will enter counter clockwise at a Slow Trot. Equine will be required to line up and stand quietly; may be asked to back at judges discretion.
- To be judged 60% on manners, quality and performance 40% on conformation.
- Martingales are optional.
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- An appropriate driving whip shall be carried (in hand or in vehicle) at all times while driving.
- Headers: A header is a capable person 13 years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that will affect the performance of any Miniature equine. Only one header is allowed per equine. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the equine when the judge is inspecting the equine, and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the equine is needed. Adult (18 years of age or older) headers are mandatory for all youth drivers and optional for all other drivers.
- No youth 12 years of age or under may drive a stallion.
- Equine must be 3 years of age or older.

Miniature Horse Driving - Reinsmanship

- This class is open to miniature equine only standing no taller than 38 inches.
- Entries are judged primarily on the rein handling ability and skill of the driver. 75% of the score is on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall working appearance of the driver. 25% is on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. Control is judged by the consistency of movement at various gaits; smooth, rapid gait changes consisting of three to four steps to be in the called gait; accuracy of performing the requested maneuver on the rail or by the complete, symmetrical pattern requested for individual work.
- At no time should the equine appear to be out of control or heavily checked up.
- Whip must be in hand at all times when the driver is in the ring.
- Drivers are asked to perform reinsmanship skills on the rail as a group. They will be asked, in addition to working both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, working trot, and strong trot, to perform according to the judge's calls. Judge may select one, several or all of the following maneuvers and may repeat the same maneuver as many times as desired to determine driver's reinsmanship skills:
 - Stop on the rail, until judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.
 - Stop on the rail, back 2 or 3 steps, stand quietly, then proceed when judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.
 - Reverse on the rail at a walk or collected trot.
 - Stop on the rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, return with a 90 degree pivot back to the rail in the original direction of go, or continue to turn with a 90 degree pivot to end up on the rail in the reverse. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.
 - Stop on rail, do a 180 degree pivot, pause, standing quietly. Then on judge's command, drive on in the reverse of the original direction at a walk or collected trot.

Mini Mule Pleasure Driving

- This class is open to miniature mules only
- A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive.
- To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back.
- To be judged:
 - 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s).
 - 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle.
 - 10% on neatness of attire.

Mini Mule Reinsmanship Driving

- This class is open to miniature mules only
- Entries are judged primarily on the rein handling ability and skill of the driver. 75% of the score is on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall working appearance of the driver. 25% is on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. Control is judged by the consistency of movement at various gaits; smooth, rapid gait changes consisting of three to four steps to be in the called gait; accuracy of performing the requested maneuver on the rail or by the complete, symmetrical pattern requested for individual work.
- At no time should the equine appear to be out of control or heavily checked up.
- Whip must be in hand at all times when the driver is in the ring.
- Drivers are asked to perform reinsmanship skills on the rail as a group. They will be asked, in addition to working both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, working trot, and strong trot, to perform according to the judge's calls. Judge may select one, several or all of the following maneuvers and may repeat the same maneuver as many times as desired to determine driver's reinsmanship skills:
 - Stop on the rail, pause and stand quietly until judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.
 - Stop on the rail, back 2 or 3 steps, stand quietly, then proceed in the direction of go when judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.
 - Reverse on the rail at a walk or collected trot.
 - Stop on the rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, return with a 90 degree pivot back to the rail in the original direction of go. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.
 - Stop on rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, continue to turn with a 90 degree pivot to end up on the rail in the reverse of the original direction of go. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.
 - Stop on rail, do a 180 degree pivot, pause, standing quietly. Then on judge's command, drive on in the reverse of the original direction at a walk or collected trot.

Mini Donkey Pleasure Driving

- This class is open to miniature donkeys only
- A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive.
- To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back.
- To be judged:
 - 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

Show Pony Driving - Working

- This class is open Show Ponies standing over 38 inches to 48 inches (12 hands).
- Gait requirements - Equines shall enter the ring counterclockwise (to the right) at a Slow Trot. All equines are to be shown both ways of the arena at a Walk, Slow Trot, Working Trot, and Strong Trot. All gaits to be performed in a smooth, relaxed, balanced manner. Each equine shall be required to back readily and straight and stand quietly.
- Martingales are optional.
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- An appropriate driving whip shall be carried (in hand or in vehicle) at all times while driving.
- Headers: A header is a capable person 13 years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that will affect the performance of any Miniature equine. Only one header is allowed per equine. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the equine when the judge is inspecting the equine, and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the equine is needed. Adult (18 years of age or older) headers are mandatory for all youth drivers and optional for all other drivers.
- No youth 12 years of age or under may drive a stallion.
- Equine must be 3 years of age or older.

Show Pony Driving - Open

- This class is open Show Ponies standing over 38 inches to 48 inches (12 Hands).
- Gait requirements—to be shown both ways of the arena at a Walk, Slow Trot, and Working Trot. Equine will enter counter clockwise at a Slow Trot. Equine will be required to line up and stand quietly; may be asked to back at judges discretion.
- To be judged 60% on manners, quality and performance 40% on conformation.
- Martingales are optional.
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- An appropriate driving whip shall be carried (in hand or in vehicle) at all times while driving.
- Headers: A header is a capable person 13 years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that will affect the performance of any Miniature equine. Only one header is allowed per equine. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the equine when the judge is inspecting the equine, and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the equine is needed. Adult (18 years of age or older) headers are mandatory for all youth drivers and optional for all other drivers.
- No youth 12 years of age or under may drive a stallion.
- Equine must be 3 years of age or older.

Show Pony Driving - Reinsmanship

- This class is open to Show Ponies standing over 38 inches to 48 inches (12 Hands).
- Entries are judged primarily on the rein handling ability and skill of the driver. 75% of the score is on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall working appearance of the driver. 25% is on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. Control is judged by the consistency of movement at various gaits; smooth, rapid gait changes consisting of three to four steps to be in the called gait; accuracy of performing the requested maneuver on the rail or by the complete, symmetrical pattern requested for individual work.
- At no time should the equine appear to be out of control or heavily checked up.
- Whip must be in hand at all times when the driver is in the ring.
- Drivers are asked to perform reinsmanship skills on the rail as a group. They will be asked, in addition to working both ways of the arena at a walk, collected trot, working trot, and strong trot, to perform according to the judge's calls. Judge may select one, several or all of the following maneuvers and may repeat the same maneuver as many times as desired to determine driver's reinsmanship skills:
 - Stop on the rail, until judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.
 - Stop on the rail, back 2 or 3 steps, stand quietly, then proceed when judge calls to move forward at a walk or collected trot.
 - Reverse on the rail at a walk or collected trot.
 - Stop on the rail, do a 90 degree pivot turning inward and pause, standing quietly. Upon judge's call, return with a 90 degree pivot back to the rail in the original direction of go, or continue to turn with a 90 degree pivot to end up on the rail in the reverse. Move forward at a walk or collected trot per judge's call.
 - Stop on rail, do a 180 degree pivot, pause, standing quietly. Then on judge's command, drive on in the reverse of the original direction at a walk or collected trot.

Driving 48" and Over - Working

- This class is open to equines over 48 inches (12 hands)
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back.
- All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests.
- To be judged:
 - a. 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s).
 - b. 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle.
 - c. 10% on neatness of attire.

Driving 48” and Over - Open

- This class is open to equines over 48 inches (12 hands)
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive.
- Gait requirements—to be shown both ways of the arena at a Walk, Slow Trot, and Working Trot. Equine will enter counter clockwise at a Slow Trot. Equine will be required to line up and stand quietly; may be asked to back at judges discretion.

Driving 48” and Over - Reinsmanship

- This class is open to equines over 48 inches (12 hands)
- An equine may be shown in all driving classes offered for their division.
- A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver.
- To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers are required to rein back.
- All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests.
- The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective.
- Either the one- or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent “feel” with the horse’s mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another.
- To be judged: •
 - 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture, and overall impression of driver.
 - 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

Trail

Trail Driving - Mini Mule

- This class is open to miniature mules only; may not cross enter into Trail Driving - Open
- Class consists of pattern work only and will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins
- Miniature Mules over 3 years old can enter this class.
- Miniature Mules to be shown under appropriate tack and attire.
- Miniature Mules may be driven with appropriate cart, or ground driven
- Miniature Mules to be shown in the pattern at the walk, secondary gait (may include extension and collection), and back up
- Obstacles may consist of gate, logs, bridge/tarp, backing through shape, slicker and other similar maneuvers
- The obstacle course is judged upon an even-paced style in approaching and overcoming each obstacle. Elimination after three refusals. Moving through the obstacle quickly and without knockdowns, refusals, unruly behavior or undue circling is the objective of this course.

Trail Driving - Open

- Class consists of pattern work only and will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins.
- Equines over 3 years old can enter this class.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate tack and attire.
- Equine may be driven with appropriate cart, or ground driven
- Equines to be shown in the pattern at the walk, secondary gait (may include extension and collection) and back up
- Obstacles may consist of gate, logs, bridge/tarp, backing through shape, slicker and other similar maneuvers
- The obstacle course is judged upon an even-paced style in approaching and overcoming each obstacle. Elimination after three refusals. Moving through the obstacle quickly and without knockdowns, refusals, unruly behavior or undue circling is the objective of this course.

In Hand Trail - Mini Mule

- This class is open to miniature mules only
- Miniature Mules of all ages can enter this class.
- Miniature Mules to be shown under appropriate English or Western tack and attire.
- Miniature Mules to be shown in the pattern at the walk, secondary gait and back up
- Obstacles may consist of gate, logs, bridge, ground tie, backing through shape, slicker and other similar maneuvers
- The obstacle course is judged upon an even-paced style in approaching and overcoming each obstacle. Elimination after three refusals. Moving through the obstacle quickly and without knockdowns, refusals, unruly behavior or undue circling is the objective of this course.
- The class consists of pattern work only and will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins

In Hand Trail - Mini Horse

- This class is open to Miniature Horses only.
- Equine of all ages can enter this class.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate English or Western tack and attire.
- Equines to be shown in the pattern at the walk, secondary gait and back up
- Obstacles may consist of gate, logs, bridge, ground tie, backing through shape, slicker and other similar maneuvers
- The obstacle course is judged upon an even-paced style in approaching and overcoming each obstacle. Elimination after three refusals. Moving through the obstacle quickly and without knockdowns, refusals, unruly behavior or undue circling is the objective of this course.
- The class consists of pattern work only and will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins

In Hand Trail - Show Pony

- Equines to be shown in the pattern at the walk, secondary gait and back up
- Obstacles may consist of gate, logs, bridge, ground tie, backing through shape, slicker and other similar maneuvers
- The obstacle course is judged upon an even-paced style in approaching and overcoming each obstacle. Elimination after three refusals. Moving through the obstacle quickly and without knockdowns, refusals, unruly behavior or undue circling is the objective of this course.
- The class consists of pattern work only and will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins

Open Trail Walk / Secondary Gait

- This class is open to all age exhibitors.
- Equines over 2 years old can enter this class.
- Equines to be shown under appropriate English or Western tack and attire.
- Equines to be shown in the pattern at the walk, secondary gait and back up
- Obstacles may consist of gate, logs, bridge, backing through shape, slicker and other similar maneuvers
- The obstacle course is judged upon an even-paced style in approaching and overcoming each obstacle. Elimination after three refusals. Moving through the obstacle quickly and without knockdowns, refusals, unruly behavior or undue circling is the objective of this course.
- The class consists of pattern work only and will be posted at least 1 hour before the class begins

In-Hand Trail Obstacle Measurements - Miniatures and Show Ponys

- Overs (plank, bridge, tarp, etc. Horse only to cross)
 - Minimum width 18"
- Overs (bridge, tarp, etc. Horse and handler to cross)
 - Minimum width & Minimum length 48"
- Multiple pole walk over between poles
 - 18"–24"

 - 24"–28"
- Elevated single pole walk or trot over
 - Maximum height 12"

- Spacing for trotovers shall be 3' to 3'6" and may be elevated to 8" (20 cm).
- Backing obstacle.
 - Backing obstacles to be spaced a minimum of 28" (71 cm). If elevated, 30" (76 cm) spacing is required.
 - Back through and around at least three markers.
 - Back through L, V, U, straight or similar-shaped course. May be elevated no more than 24" (60 cm).

 - An obstacle consisting of four logs or rails, laid in a square.

At the end of the year, there will be an awards banquet for the Johnston County Equine Show Series where the awards and prizes will be presented. Riders are not required to participate in a minimum number of shows to qualify for year-end awards
